



- ✓ Help overcome business case gap
- ✓ Connectivity demand stimulation in rural areas
- ✓ Accelerate / facilitate infrastructure sharing notably for mobile connections (Cost Reduction Directive)
- ✓ Streamline / facilitate construction permits

Possible actions to accelerate mountain / rural connectivity



- Create dialogue with investors to identify intervention needs
- ✓ Work with national authorities in charge of "mapping" to target (and refine) intervention areas
- ✓ Work with and strengthen **BCOs** in countries / regions to support local stakeholders
